This struggle found its voice in the literature of partition produced by various writers of India, Pakistan and Bangladesh in different languages. Literature played an immense role in India's freedom struggle as it gave birth to many nationalist artists who tried to influence the public psyche through their work. It not only led to a silent criticism of colonial atrocities but also acted as a force to unite mass against colonial forces. India's freedom struggle actually spanned 70-80 years since the later half of the 19th century. The history of freedom struggle is replete with the saga of sacrifice, selflessness and bravery. The Freedom Struggle would be incomplete without mentioning the contributions and the sacrifices made by the women of India. They fought with true spirit and undaunted courage and faced various tortures, exploitations and hardships to earn freedom. Discussions on partition have historically been read and narrated by the experiences of various writers who successfully tried to portray on the canvas through the might of their pen.

The writers of the partition literature presented the disastrous situation of partition in a different way as the historians depicted. Their literary works embodied the human sufferings, agony and trauma of partition. Writers such as Krishan Chander, Rajinder Singh Bedi, Amrita Pritam, K. S. Duggal, Saadat Hasan Manto, Nanak Singh, Ismat Chugtai, Khushwant Singh, Yasmeen Khan, Aman Zakaria, and others have revolved their writings on the subject of partition. Salman Rushdie's 'Midnight's Children', Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay's Anandamath, set during the famine in Bengal, also highlighted various patriotic acts, the sacrifices made by his characters and ordinary people who left their homes and families to fight against subjection. The prime purpose of the seminar is to highlight such great personalities who dedicated their lives and also sacrificed all the pleasure and happiness of their life for the cause of the nation.


